Hawai'i's indigenous artist and educator, Sean Browne, will share and discuss his work at the slide presentation at KCC.

A graduate of Kamehameha Schools, and educated at the University of Redlands and the University of Hawaii, Sean has shared his experiences and insights with students through his work as a teacher and sculptor at Kapiolani Community College. Sean studied stone carving in both Italy and in Japan, under a Fulbright Fellowship, with renowned master sculptor Isamu Noguchi. Sean has and continues to execute works throughout the State of Hawaii. Some of these works include the statue of King Kalakaua at the gateway to Waikiki, works at the Wailuku Judiciary Complex, Keahole-Kona Airport and the Kaneohe State Hospital. Sean considers his native Hawaiian roots as the center of inspiration for all of his creative output as both an educator and artist.
